






Creative Commons Licensing

OER = Open Educational Resource. My online textbook is OER. Free and available to anyone online.

Your work is OER also. As you learn from previous Flow Vis students for Best Of Web and other assignments, so others will learn from your work.





Stats for August 2024

In order for your work to be OER, it must be free for the end user to own, share, and in most cases, modify.

This is typically done through a Creative Commons license, not a copyright. https://creativecommons.org/share-your-work/cclicenses/

The CCO Public Domain Dedication

Release all claim on your work. Anybody can do anything with it, and not even credit you.

CC BY - say who it's by.

This license enables reusers to distribute, remix, adapt, and build upon the material in any medium or format, so long as attribution is given to the creator. This is our current licensing for the Flowvis.org website. Anybody can take our work, and commercialize it.

CC BY-SA - share alike

Same as above plus

If you remix, adapt, or build upon the material, you must license the modified material under identical terms. Can be commercialized.

CC BY-NC - non commercial

Same as BY but nobody can commercialize it

CC BY-NC-SA - non commercial, share alike

Same as BY-NC and adaptations have to also be BY-NC-SA

except you've agreed to let me use them for academic purposes.

CC BY-ND - no derivatives

Your work can be commercialized, but not changed

CC BY-NC-ND

Your work cannot be commercialized or changed. Others can repost it, but that's all, and they still have to give attribution to you.


